

PAGUNGWA – KARIBA

FACT SHEET

PAGUNGWA is situated on Eagle Drive between AMC/TOTAL Diesels and the Kariba Breezes complex.

The Lodge can comfortably sleep 8 people (maximum) including children.

FADWICK is the cook/domestic, and **DAVID** is the gardener as well as a limited “deck hand” assisting with boats, cleaning fish, doing the braai etc. Please discuss “local conditions” on your arrival with them. There are double domestic quarters on the property.

Please note the following and refer to the INSTRUCTIONS overleaf:

- Security
- Water
- Power
- Refrigeration
- Rooms
- Wifi

DAVID is responsible for the electric game fence. The fence remains armed permanently to deter wild animals from entering the property. He locks the gate at 6 pm to keep the animals out. If you are out at night please let him know so he can wait up to switch off the fence and unlock the gate.

The Staff will “knock off” duty after cooking your evening meal so please lock the doors and close the windows in the kitchen, lounge and dining rooms and lock the passage door when you go to bed.

All linen and crockery are provided, however you need to take the following:

- Swimming towels and your own personal pillows if you so wish.
- Toiletries (including single ply loo rolls), insect repellent, malaria tablets, cleaning materials, padlock for the “safe”, diesel for the generator (if necessary), charcoal (if necessary).
- Food, drink and ice.

There is a fridge/freezer + chest freezer available + a four plate gas stove with oven/grill as well as a microwave.

We also have a splash pool. Although taller people can stand in the pool take care especially if you’re not a swimmer.

There is a bar on the veranda which you can stock, as well as ice cooler boxes which are to be used for all drinks.

A charcoal braai is available but please supply your own charcoal. We DON’T chop trees for wood!

Ice and limited groceries can be obtained from the shop at AMC Diesels up the road at the garage or Marineland. Groceries can also be obtained from TM in Nyamunga. Ideally take your own groceries.

Boat hire, fuel, bait etc. is available from Marineland which is over the hill towards Caribbea Bay. Speak to Alex, the Harbour Master, or Obert (“Orbit”, the General Manager) for help.

We are not responsible for any loss, accidents or injuries to person (s) staying in or personal effects at **Pagungwa**. Beware of wild animals, the swimming pool, balconies, electric fence and traffic on the main road particularly on entering or exiting **Pagungwa**. Look after your valuables and belongings.

PLEASE REMEMBER:

- Kariba is a MALARIA AREA
- ANIMALS have right of way
- PLEASE BEWARE of the BABOONS – they can come inside the house so do “whatever it takes” to chase them
- PLEASE LEAVE FISH IN THE LAKE FOR THE NEXT PERSON – “EAT WHAT YOU CATCH”

Any damage to **Pagungwa** property/equipment during your stay is your responsibility, including any breakages.

INSTRUCTIONS

SECURITY

- There is a security system that guests can operate with a remote control which you can get from FADWICK. It covers the lodge surrounds, garages, storeroom, lounge, dining room and kitchen (the OWNER'S security covers the hallway cupboard, pantry and downstairs storeroom – WHICH IS NOT ACCESSIBLE)
- There is a remote button that FADWICK has that you should use when you ALL go to bed. Lock all external doors and door in passage to lounge then activate the remote.
- If the alarm sounds please investigate with the domestics. If it persists, DO NOT disarm it until you've checked everything - there could be thieves so BE PREPARED. Once clear, then reset.
- We have an old rifle cabinet in the main room we use as a safe for all valuables – supply your own padlock. Please lock your valuables away in the safe or place them in locked cupboards but keep them out of sight.
- Please note that strong winds and wild animals can set off the alarm.
- Remember when people are there you are potentially a target so please be security conscious at all time.

WATER – MAINS, TANK, BOREHOLE, GEYSERS

- We typically get mains water, but this can be erratic
- We have a 5,000 water tank with motor that we can use in emergencies. This is kept full at all times
- We also have a limited borehole for use in EXTREME emergencies to top-up the tank
- FADWICK and DAVID are responsible for the water system and usage
- PLEASE USE WATER SPARINGLY
- We have both electric and solar geysers. We seldom switch on the mains geyser with ZESA because the solar geyser is adequate. At times even the tank water is warm enough to use for showering. So please ensure the mains geyser is switched off at the Main Control Board (MCB).
- The geyser valves outside the back door do not need to be adjusted – please ask FADWICK or DAVID if there is a problem.

POWER – ZESA, GENERATOR

- We have ZESA power for most of the time unless there is load-shedding or a fault.
- When there is a power cut we typically wait and see if it will last longer than a few minutes. In the meantime please switch off all lights, fridge, freezer, aircons etc. When the power comes back on please slowly switch everything back on again.
- We have a 6.50 KVA diesel generator FOR EMERGENCIES ONLY - in the event ZESA is off for longer than several hours. This is ONLY for the FRIDGE & FREEZER plus LIGHTS and FANS. It is NOT for the AIRCONS because the generator can't cope and diesel may not be easily available.
- Please replace any diesel you use.

FRIDGE, FREEZERS, COOLER BOXES

- The fridge is for priority perishable etc. food stuffs NOT drinks. Please don't open and close the fridge too often since it won't cope under Kariba conditions
- All drinks must be put in the cooler boxes on the veranda using your own ice. Ice can be bought from the TOTAL AMC shop up the hill or at Marineland. And it can be stored in the second cooler box on the veranda
- ZESA permitting, the deep freeze in the kitchen can be used for food stuff - meat etc. and one downstairs for ice.

ROOMS – SCREENS, FANS, AIRCON

- Each bedroom is equipped with air conditioning but please use it sparingly - only at night due to the amount of electricity it consumes and wear and tear under Kariba conditions.
- If required switch it on just before going to bed to cool the room and this should be fine for the night. Set it at 23-25C. Keep the windows open, curtains closed (en suite bathroom curtains closed as well for optimum effect), gauze screens down and fans on during the night.

Wi-Fi

- There is Wi-Fi available on request for your access but please DON'T DOWN-LOAD LARGE FILES and use up the data. The name is *Pagungwa* and PIN is "*Hexadecimal*" and the number is 261 2146374
